Mark Neale is a director and writer with over fifteen years experience in the creation of cutting-edge film, TV and new media.

His recent work includes CHARGE (2011), a feature-length documentary about the world's first zero-emissions motorcycle races on the Isle of Man, and two award-winning feature films about grand prix motorcycle racing, FASTER (2004) and The Doctor, The Tornado & The Kentucky Kid (2006). He also made the internationally acclaimed documentary No Maps For These Territories, about cult sci-fi author William Gibson (2001).

As a music video director, Neale earned a MTV Best Director nomination for U2's Stay (Faraway So Close), co-directed with Wim Wenders. He also directed the U2 video Lemon and numerous hits for artists including Counting Crows, Paul Weller and The Verve Pipe.

His other credits include: video art for U2's ZOO TV world tour; two 13-part series for television, Mojo Working (1991, Channel 4 UK) and BUZZ (1990, Channel 4 UK and MTV USA)); and Ambassador Of Goodwill, a documentary for the United Nations High Commission for Refugees. For Expo '92 in Spain, he co-directed Memory Palace, a show combining film and live performance with music by Peter Gabriel and John Paul Jones of Led Zeppelin. In 1989 Neale was the winner of the Kodak/Lloyds Bank commercials competition for new directors.

A UK native, Neale has lived in Los Angeles since 1998. He is currently making FASTEST, the sequel to his 2004 hit FASTER.
